Dear Agape Family,

We are thankful for each one of you who faithfully pray and give to support *Agape Evangelical Ministries International!* We pray you will be strengthened in your faith and prayer life as you learn what God is doing through our ministry and praise Him! Since our last newsletter we began an orphan & vulnerable child sponsorship program, and our first Bible study and prayer group for the next eight weeks on Saturday afternoon's as we study Ephesians together. We also have people who have signed up for our evangelical medical mission for this October! Please continue to pray for us **(see our praises and prayers).** We have much work ahead of us. We also would like to wish each of you and your families a wonderful and joyful Easter. Christ is risen, He is risen indeed, Jesus Christ is Lord.

Whether we are teaching and discipling our family or neighbors or have received a specific call to evangelize and disciple another tribe or nation, we are all missionaries. The first missionary God sent, was His Only Begotten Son, Jesus. We are his followers. God the Son [Jesus] became flesh and lived among us. (John 1:14). God sent His only Son to make his love and rescue plan known to us (John 1:18). Jesus laid down his life and die for the sins of the world, (John 3:16). As Christians we are to lay down our lives for one another. Only a sinless (God/Man) could become our Savior and be raised from the dead and ascend into heaven. He is our Great High Priest and Intercessor (Heb. 10:3-18). Before Jesus went to heaven, he also gave a charge, first to his own apostles- "Go and make disciples of all nations ... (Matthew 28:18-20). One such missionary we recently celebrated as an official American holiday was St. Patrick.

🗣 "A Holy Servant Boy's Calling" 🤻

St. Patrick's Day in the United States of America began in Boston, Massachusetts in 1737. He was born *Maewyn Succat* in Romano-Britian in 385 A.D. Patrick lived on an Estate in a Roman-Christian home at the end of Roman rule in Britian. His father was a deacon, and his grandfather was a priest and had learned about Jesus in his formative years. At the age of sixteen, he was captured by *Irish pirates* and was sold into slavery where he was forced to work as a shepherd boy for six long years. *According to his writings*, it was during his captivity, that he received God's unconditional free gift of grace, mercy and forgiveness in Jesus and personally appropriated him as his own Lord and Savior. It was during his time in captivity his faith and dependency in Christ would grow. Isn't it during our own trials and suffering that God wants us to strengthen our faith and dependency in Christ? Patrick knew he would escape and walked 200 miles from County Mayo to the Irish coast. A few years after his return home, Patrick received a second revelation. An angel would tell him to return to Ireland and "walk among them [the Irish] as a holy servant boy." The people who had enslaved him, were the very ones God was calling Him to evangelize and disciple for Christ.

Before returning to Ireland, Patrick studied for several years in Gaul becoming an ordained priest, and later a bishop. His name would be changed to Patrick. Patrick would bring many people to faith in Jesus Christ who had worshipped false gods. He is believed to have been successful because of his approach in relating to their culture and using their language to teach them about Jesus. He did not attempt to remove their native beliefs or cultural identity. He is legendary for using the shamrock (a 3-leaf clover) to teach the ancient Irish people about the *Holy Trinity*. He also is believed to have possibly come up with the symbol of the Celtic cross. St. Patrick died in Ireland on March 17th, 461 A.D. Even though he was never officially canonized, Patrick is venerated as a saint by Catholics and Protestants alike. He is known as the *"Apostle to the Irish Nation."*
